**WASHINGTON, D.C.** – U.S. Chamber Senior Vice President for National Security and Emergency Preparedness Ann Beauchesne today issued the following statement regarding the introduction of the “Digital Security Commission Act of 2016”:

*“The U.S. Chamber commends Rep. Michael McCaul and Sen. Mark Warner for introducing the ‘Digital Security Commission Act of 2016,’ bipartisan legislation that would establish a National Commission on Security and Technology Challenges.*

*“The Commission is expected to be composed of 16 individuals with expertise in areas such as international commerce and economics, cryptography, law enforcement, technology, privacy and civil liberties, and intelligence.*

*“Most significantly, the Commission would enable a process for Congress to consider complex issues involving Americans’ values and policy objectives regarding economics, privacy, and digital security at home and in the global marketplace.*
