


## Worst November on Record: A Devastating, Utter Disaster for the Country

- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) recorded 308,728 encounters <u>nationwide</u> in November, including 242,418 at the Southwest border (SWB)—the worst November on CBP record. SWB encounters increased 38% compared to November 2021 and 3% compared to November 2022.
- At the SW border in November 2023, CBP encountered **125,336 single adults, 104,154 family unit individuals,** and **12,808 unaccompanied children along the Southwest border.**
- Encounters by the Office of Field Operations (OFO) nationwide in November increased 54% compared to November 2022, totaling 116,366.
- **43,000 inadmissible aliens** were processed by OFO with CBP One app appointments in November. Since January 2023, **360,000 individuals** have scheduled appointments with the app.
- In response to a subpoena threat, the Committee on Homeland Security recently received startling information and documents regarding the expanded use of the CBP One app by DHS Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas:
  - Overall, **95.8 percent of all inadmissible aliens who scheduled appointments through the app during this time were ultimately issued a "Notice to Appear" and released** into the United States on parole.
- Since the program began, 297,000 Cubans, Haitians, Nicaraguans, and Venezuelans have been granted mass parole under the administration's CHNV parole process at ports of entry nationwide.
- Since President Biden and Secretary Mayorkas took office, there have been 8 million encounters nationwide and over 6.7 million encounters at the Southwest border.
- Since the beginning of the Biden administration, over 1.7 million known gotaways have evaded U.S. Border Patrol. In testimony before the Committee, former Chief of U.S. Border Patrol Raul Ortiz said the number of both known and unknown gotaways could be 20% higher.
- In November 2023, 4,797 Chinese nationals were encountered at the Southwest border. This represents a nearly 800% increase compared to November 2022.
- In November 2023, **18 more individuals whose names appear on the terrorist watchlist** were stopped trying to cross the U.S.-Mexico border between ports of entry.
- Since Fiscal Year (FY) 2021, 312 of these individuals have attempted cross our Southwest border illegally.





## Mayorkas' Open-Borders Policies are Incentivizing a Surge & Impacting Border Patrol's Mission

- In November, CBP arrested 6,422 aliens with criminal convictions nationwide, including 83 known gang members, 10 of those being MS-13 members.
- Last month, CBP, including Air and Marine Operations, seized 1,846 pounds of fentanyl coming across the Southwest border—enough to kill more than 400 million people.
  - Federal officials estimate they are only able to seize 5-10% of fentanyl smuggled across the Southwest border.
- On November 29, **Mayorkas met with the Border Patrol agents** who were falsely accused of whipping migrants in 2021, but he did not apologize for the administration's false accusations.
- On November 28, it was reported that Border Patrol in the Del Rio Sector had arrested at least 21 child sex
  offenders crossing illegally since FY2024 began.
- On November 28, more Border Patrol agents along the northern and coastal borders were asked to help with virtual processing of inadmissible aliens encountered at the Southwest border.
- On November 27, a Border Patrol checkpoint outside Lukeville, AZ was closed to relocate agents for processing
  of illegal and inadmissible aliens.
- On November 27, vehicle processing was suspended at a port of entry in Eagle Pass, Texas to redirect CBP personnel to assist with processing mass illegal crossings in the area.
- In just one week, the Tucson Sector alone saw 14,300 illegal crossings.
- On November 14, **304** pounds of fentanyl were seized between ports on entry on just one day along the Southwest border.
- On November 8, a human smuggler killed 8 people, including two U.S. citizens, in a car crash while attempting to evade law enforcement in Texas.

## **The Northern Border Surge Continues**

- Encounters at the northern border in November 2023 increased 160% compared to November 2021 and increased 5% compared to November 2022.
- Last month, encounters along the busiest sector of the northern border, the Swanton Sector, increased 95% compared to the previous November and 1,939% compared to November 2021.
- So far in FY2024, 1 individual on the terrorist watchlist has been encountered attempting to cross the northern border illegally, bringing the total in the last four fiscal years to 5.
