"After our nearly year-long investigation and subsequent impeachment proceedings, and having exhausted all other options to hold him accountable, it is unmistakably clear to all of us—and to the American people—that Congress must exercise its constitutional duty and impeach Secretary Mayorkas. The Secretary has consistently willfully and

systemically refused to follow the laws passed by Congress, abused his authority, and breached the trust of Congress

and the American people on numerous occasions. The result of his failure to fulfill his oath of office has been a border

crisis that is unprecedented in American history—a crisis that has cost the lives of thousands of Secretary Mayorkas' fellow Americans." On Thursday, the Committee **held a hearing** pursuant to its impeachment proceedings, titled, "Voices for the Victims: The Heartbreaking Reality of the Mayorkas Border Crisis," in which members heard testimony from parents who have lost children from the fentanyl flowing across the Southwest border and from crimes perpetrated by those coming here illegally on Secretary Mayorkas' watch. On Jan. 10, the Committee held its first hearing as part of the proceedings,

Speaker of the House Mike Johnson stated on CBS' "Face the Nation" earlier this month, "Our Homeland Security Committee has done its job. These reports conclusively establish that Secretary Mayorkas is chiefly responsible for the chaos and devastation that has unfolded at America's borders over the past three years. His willful and systemic refusal to follow the laws passed by Congress has incentivized unprecedented mass illegal immigration. He has abused his power by directing his department to implement policies contrary to federal statute and abandoning viable enforcement initiatives, and he has breached the public trust by willfully misleading Congress and the American people on numerous occasions about the consequences of his decisions and the operational realities on the border. As a result of his refusal to follow the law and abuse of power, the criminal cartels have been empowered, Americans and migrants alike are suffering in record numbers, and cities and states across the country are assuming massive financial costs.

As part of the investigative process, the Committee has conducted 10 full and subcommittee hearings, gathering testimony from more than two dozen witnesses. The Committee, along with the House Oversight Committee, also conducted transcribed interviews of chief and deputy chief patrol agents responsible for the Border Patrol's nine Southwest border sectors as part of this investigation. These senior agents gave compelling insights into the many consequences of Secretary Mayorkas' open-borders policies:

- Never before have agents seen such <u>historic</u> numbers of illegal crossings
- The <u>lack of consequences enforced</u> by DHS for illegal entry
- Mass releases functioning as a pull factor for millions of illegal aliens
- Illegal aliens are now turning themselves in to Border Patrol, knowing they will be released into the interior
- The expansive degree of <u>cartel control</u> at the Southwest border
- Agents are being taken out of the field in order to help process and release illegal aliens
- Illegal aliens are **spreading the word** of our open border back home, encouraging more crossings • The operational impacts of open borders, including closed checkpoints and national security/public safety risks
- Border Patrol sector chiefs contradict Secretary Mayorkas, say they do not have operational control in their sectors
