Illegal Crossings of the Southwest Border Increased in April Ahead Title 42 End



- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) had <u>211,401 alien encounters along the Southwest Border (SWB) in April 2023</u>
 up almost 10% from the previous month and up nearly 20% from April 2021.
- 86% of the total SWB encounters were between ports of entry up 12% from March.
- Total CBP include 140,678 single adults, 58,964 family unit individuals, and 11,478 unaccompanied children. Two-thirds of total encounters were single adults.
- CBP expelled 74,027 individuals under Title 42 in April 2023 35% of the overall total and down significantly from March's 46%.
 - With alien encounters up in April as the end of Title 42 neared in May, the Biden administration used Title 42 even less than the previous month.
- Since the beginning of FY2023, there have been a historic over 1.8 million alien encounters at our borders nationwide.
- The total number of April 2023 encounters includes **28,738 Cubans**, **Haitians**, **Nicaraguans**, **and Venezuelans**, who were released into the country under the **Biden administration's newest parole program**.
- Since President Biden has been in office, there have been over **5 million encounters at the Southwest border**, in addition to **nearly 1.5 million known gotaways** who evaded U.S. Border Patrol agents.
 - According to testimony from Border Patrol Chief Raul Ortiz before the Homeland Security Committee in March in Pharr, Texas, there are approximately an <u>additional 20% of illegal alien 'gotaways' that go unaccounted for.</u>
- In April, CBP processed over <u>22,000 individuals</u> at ports of entry as exceptions to Title 42 based on the CBP One app appointment scheduler—this is one of the latest attempts by the Biden administration to increase the processing of aliens into the interior and conceal the number.
 - A recent media report shows that <u>99% of all applicants</u> on the CBP One App are being accepted and released into the country, further showcasing the Biden administration's deceptive catch-and-release tactics.
- In just the first seven months of FY2023, <u>96 people whose</u> names appear on the terrorist watchlist, including a <u>shocking 16 in April alone</u>, were stopped trying to cross the U.S.-Mexico border between ports of entry. April had more terrorist watchlist apprehensions at the SWB than all of FY2017, FY2018, FY2019, & FY2020 combined.
- So far in FY2023, two individuals on the terrorist watchlist have been stopped attempting to cross the Northern border between ports of entry.

- So far in FY2023, nationwide, CBP has <u>arrested 17,533 individuals with criminal convictions</u> and apprehended **377 known gang members**, **111** of those being MS-13 members.
- In FY2023 alone, CBP has seized over <u>17,000 pounds of fentanyl</u> coming across the Southwest border—enough to kill over <u>3.8 billion people.</u>
 - Federal officials estimate they are <u>only able to seize 5%-10% of all illegal drugs smuggled</u> across the Southwest border.
- In April 2023, fentanyl seizures at the Southwest border increased 14% compared to the previous month. If this extreme rate of fentanyl seizures continues, FY2023 is on track to nearly double last year's fentanyl seizure total at the Southwest border.
 - A new DHS enforcement operation known as Operation Four Horseman seized 800 pounds of fentanyl between ports of entry from March 13 to April 13, 2023 — enough to kill more than 180 million people.
- According to *New York Times* reporting, the Department of Health and Human Services has been unable to contact 85,000 Missing Unaccompanied Alien Children (UACs) residing in the U.S.
- On April 17, CBP in Nogales, Arizona seized <u>860,000 fentanyl pills and 15 pounds of fentanyl powder in just two smuggling busts.</u>
- On April 19, a Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) trooper stopped a couple in Waller, Texas who were smuggling six illegal immigrants and **two children**, **aged just four and one**, to a stash house in Houston.
- On April 12, Texas DPS seized <u>3.1 million doses of fentanyl in one single traffic stop, an all-time record</u> and enough to kill every person in Dallas, Austin, and El Paso, Texas combined.
- In early April, a <u>human smuggler attempted to run over a Texas DPS trooper</u> who was trying to apprehend the suspect in Zavala County, Texas.
- On April 4, Eagle Pass Border Patrol agents apprehended a <u>high-ranking member of a Panamanian</u> transnational criminal gang known as "Los Killas."

Northern Border Encounters Still on the Rise

- As of April 2023, the most active sector of the Northern border, **the Swanton Sector**, has seen an increase in alien encounter of **more than 700% compared to April 2022.**
- The total number of alien encounters at the Northern Border in April 2023 has increased over <u>1,000% since April</u> 2021.
