
#### Border Encounters Officially Hit 9 Million Nationwide on Secretary Mayorkas' Watch

- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) recorded 256,094 encounters nationwide in February, including 189,922 at the Southwest border (SWB)—the worst February in decades.
- Nationwide encounters increased 19% compared to February of Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 and 121% compared to Feb. FY21. SWB encounters increased 21% compared to FY23 and 87% compared to February FY21.
- Since President Biden and Secretary Mayorkas took office, there have been 9 million encounters nationwide and over 7.4 million encounters at the Southwest border.
- Last month was the worst February in decades for encounters by the Office of Field Operations (OFO) at the Southwest border (49,278). Nationwide OFO encounters in February (113,987) increased 542% compared to February FY21—the first full month of the Biden administration.
- Additionally, over 1.8 million known gotaways have evaded U.S. Border Patrol under this
  administration. In testimony before the Committee last year, then-chief of U.S. Border Patrol (USBP),
  Raul Ortiz, said the total number of gotaways could be undercounted by as much as 20%.
- Southwest border encounters of illegal aliens by USBP between ports of entry (140,644) increased 8% from February FY23.
- At the SW border in February 2024, CBP encountered 114,297 single adults, 65,141 family unit individuals, and 10,362 unaccompanied children.
- 42,100 inadmissible aliens were processed by OFO with CBP One app appointments in February.
   Since January 2023, 501,000 individuals have scheduled appointments with the app. 95.8 percent of all inadmissible aliens who scheduled appointments through the app from January-September 2023 were ultimately issued a "Notice to Appear" and released into the United States on parole.
- Since the program began, 386,000 Cubans, Haitians, Nicaraguans, and Venezuelans have been mass paroled under the administration's CHNV parole program at ports of entry nationwide.
- In February 2024, 11 more individuals whose names appear on the terrorist watchlist were stopped trying to cross the U.S.-Mexico border between ports of entry. Since FY21, 351 of these individuals have been caught crossing our Southwest border illegally.

### <u>Secretary Mayorkas Endangers Americans With Catch-and-Release, Unlawful Mass Parole</u>

- So far this fiscal year, CBP has arrested 14,949 aliens with criminal convictions or outstanding warrants nationwide, including 195 known gang members, 30 of those being MS-13 members.
- In February, CBP, including Air and Marine Operations (AMO), seized 1,185 pounds of fentanyl coming across the Southwest border, bringing the total for the fiscal year to 8,112 pounds—enough to kill nearly 2 billion people.
  - Federal officials estimate they are only able to seize 5-10% of the fentanyl smuggled across the Southwest border.
- So far in FY24, 22,292 Chinese nationals have been encountered at the Southwest border. Encounters of Chinese nationals this fiscal year have increased 924% compared to all of FY22.
- On February 22, Venezuelan national Jose Antonio Ibarra was arrested and charged with the murder of 22-year-old Athens, Georgia, student Laken Riley. Ibarra entered the country illegally in September 2022 and was subsequently released by CBP into the interior.
  - The Committee has requested copies of Ibarra's "A-file," which contains the complete record of an inadmissible alien's interactions with DHS law enforcement, including CBP, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), and U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). DHS has still not provided any documentation.
- In February, encounters increased in California following enforcement efforts by the State of Texas.
   On February 23-24, inadmissible aliens who illegally crossed the San Diego Sector were mass-released in San Ysidro, California.
  - Many of these aliens were assigned ankle monitors as part of ICE's Alternatives to Detention
    (ATD) program and were then offered rides to the airport by Non-Governmental
    Organizations (NGOs).
- According to CBP data, more Chinese nationals have crossed the San Diego Sector illegally this
  fiscal year than Mexican nationals.

#### Worst February on Record for Northern Border Encounters

- Encounters at the northern border in February FY24 increased 135% compared to February FY22 and increased 11% compared to the previous February.
- Last month, encounters along the busiest sector of the northern border, the Swanton Sector, increased 107% compared to the previous February and more than 5,000% compared to Feb. FY21.
