
Mayorkas' Post-Title 42 Shell Game Attempts to Hide Startling Crisis at Southwest Border

- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) had 204,561 alien encounters along the Southwest Border (SWB) in May 2023
 —up over 13% from May 2021.
- While the Biden Administration is celebrating a reported 25% decrease in encounters between **ports of entry, 35,317 aliens** were encountered at ports of entry 17% of the total encounters in May. According to the Office of Field Operations (OFO), this is a 20% increase from April 2023 and a staggering 34% increase from January 2023, when the CBP One app was first expanded to non-commercial use.
 - 28,696 inadmissible aliens were processed by OFO with CBP One app appointments. As promised, Secretary Mayorkas expanded the number of daily admission to more than 1,000 per day via the app in May.
 - A recent media report shows that 99% of all CBP One app applicants_were accepted before the end of Title 42 and released into the country, further showcasing the Biden administration's deceptive catch-and-release tactics.
 - The increase in OFO encounters depicts that once Title 42 ended on May 11, Secretary Mayorkas utilized the CBP One app to shift more, otherwise illegal, aliens to ports of entry in order to make it appear that "illegal" crossings were decreasing. Almost all of these inadmissible aliens will ultimately be released into the interior, regardless of whether they are granted parole.
- In May 2023, 133,097 single adults, 61,319 family unit individuals, and 9,943 unaccompanied children were encountered along the Southwest border. 65% of total encounters were single adults. Encounters of family unit individuals increased 5% from the previous month.
- So far in FY23, 12,642 Chinese nationals have been encountered at the Southwest border, with May recording a 1,200% increase in these encounters compared to May 2022.
- In the first 11 days of May, before the end of Title 42, CBP expelled 30,150 individuals under the public health authority.
- Since President Biden took office, there have been roughly **5.45 million encounters at the Southwest border**, in addition to **over 1.5 million known gotaways** who evaded U.S. Border Patrol.
- Since the beginning of Fiscal Year 2023, there have been over 1.6 million alien encounters at our Southwest border.
- In just the first eight months of the fiscal year, 125 people
 whose names appear on the terrorist watchlist were
 stopped trying to cross the U.S.-Mexico border between ports
 of entry, surpassing last fiscal year's total of 98.
- A shocking 29 were arrested attempting to cross in May alone, more than all of FY17, FY18, FY19, & FY20 combined and the largest one-month total ever.
 - This includes the apprehensions of a Pakistani national and an Afghan national.

Secretary Mayorkas' Catch-and-Release Agenda is Incentivizing a Crisis

- So far in FY23, CBP has arrested 20,923 aliens with criminal convictions nationwide, including 442 known gang members, 134 of those being MS-13 members.
- In FY23 alone, CBP has seized over 20,000 pounds of fentanyl coming across the Southwest border—enough to kill over 4.6 billion people.
- Notably, Federal officials estimate they are only able to seize 5-10% of all illegal drugs smuggled across the Southwest border.
- In May 2023, fentanyl seizures at the Southwest border increased 136% compared to May 2022. If this extreme rate of
 fentanyl seizures continues, FY23 is on track to double last year's fentanyl seizure total at the Southwest border.
- On May 2, President Biden announced the deployment of 1,500 troops to the Southwest border ahead of the end of Title 42—contradicting to Secretary Mayorkas' statement that the "border is secure."
- Leading up to the end of Title 42, Border Patrol reported more than 10,000 illegal alien apprehensions a day.
- In the first week of May, Border Patrol reported nearly **55,000 apprehensions and more than 18,500 known gotaways at** the Southwest border—the highest ever recorded in one week.
- In early May, hundreds of aliens resided on the streets of El Paso, Texas after being released en masse by CBP.
- A week before the end of Title 42, FEMA announced it would give \$332,500,000 to local governments and nonprofits
 within the interior of the U.S. to help illegal aliens who were released.
- According to a DHS Inspector General report released in March, \$100 million of federal taxpayer funds were spent by Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) to aid illegal aliens released into the interior. This is one more way the Biden administration is passing along the cost of its crisis onto the American people.
- According to media reports, numerous illegal aliens who claimed asylum at the Southwest border were released into the U.S. interior with court dates out as far as 2035.
- While apprehensions hit historic highs the weeks before the end of Title 42, 8,000 ICE detention beds remained empty showcasing the Biden administration commitment to its catch-and-release agenda.

The Northern Border Crisis is Only Getting Worse

- Encounters at the Northern border in May 2023 increased 1,000% compared to May 2021 and increased nearly 20% compared to the previous month.
- Encounters along the busiest sector of the Northern border, the Swanton Sector, have increased 920% since May 2021.
- 2 suspected terrorists have been stopped attempting to cross the Northern border between ports of entry this fiscal year.
