## <u>President Trump Continues Whole-of-Government Effort to Secure Our Borders</u>

- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) **nationwide border encounters** in August (26,191) **decreased over 83%** compared to August 2024 (158,893).
- Southwest border encounters (9,740) dropped nearly 91% since last August (107,473).
- Border Patrol apprehensions between ports of entry at the Southwest border last month (6,321) decreased 89% compared to August 2024 (58,009). In August, Border Patrol averaged just 204 apprehensions of illegal aliens per day—96% lower than the daily average under the Biden administration.
- CBP encounters of inadmissible aliens at the Northern border dropped nearly 64%\_in August 2025 (6,837) compared to August 2024 (18,944).
- With CBP's efforts to combat drug smuggling across our borders, **nationwide seizures of cocaine**, **methamphetamine**, **heroin**, **fentanyl**, **and marijuana (combined, by weight) increased 9.2% from the month prior in August**.
- In August, for the fourth month in a row, zero inadmissible aliens were released by USBP into American communities, compared to the 10,186 inadmissible aliens that were released under Joe Biden last August.
- Through Operation Pacific Viper, the U.S. Coast Guard has interdicted more than 75,000 pounds of cocaine and apprehended nearly 60 suspected cartel drug smugglers since August. Now that our land borders are secure, cartels are turning to our maritime borders.
- The Trump administration has removed over 332,000 inadmissible aliens from the U.S., with removal numbers reaching 1,500 per day in August.
- In testimony last week, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Director Kash Patel confirmed that since January 20, 2025, the FBI has made over 25,000 immigrationrelated arrests in the interior, including 350 members of Tren de Aragua (TdA), and 195 members of MS-13.
