## FY2025 Numbers Show Lowest SW Border Apprehensions in Half a Century



- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) nationwide border encounters in September decreased 82% (144,666 vs 26,002) compared to September 2024. Southwest border encounters in September decreased 88.6% (101,790 vs 11,647) compared to last September.
- FY2025 closed on a strong note, with 79% fewer Southwest border encounters than FY2024 (443,671 vs 2,135,005), and 76% fewer nationwide encounters (691,906 vs 2,901,142). U.S. Border Patrol (USBP) apprehensions between ports of entry at the Southwest border in FY25 (237,538) hit the lowest level since 1970.
- USBP apprehensions between ports of entry at the Southwest border in September (8,386) decreased 84.4% compared to September 2024 (53,858). In September, Border Patrol averaged just 279 apprehensions of illegal aliens per day—95% lower than the daily average under the Biden administration.
- CBP encounters of inadmissible aliens at the Northern border dropped nearly 74% in September 2025 (4,436) compared to September 2024 (17,127).
- In September, for the fifth month in a row, zero inadmissible aliens were released by USBP into American communities, compared to the 9,144 inadmissible aliens that were released under Joe Biden last September.
- Through Operation Pacific Viper, the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) has interdicted more than 100,000 pounds of cocaine, averaging about 1,600 lbs. of cocaine interdicted daily since August.
- According to the Washington Examiner, the USCG seized a "record-high \$3.8 billion worth of cocaine" from Eastern Pacific and Caribbean smugglers in FY2025.
