October Marks the Lowest Start to a Fiscal Year Ever for Nationwide Encounters

- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) nationwide border encounters in October decreased 79% compared to October 2024 (30,573 vs 142,742).
- Southwest border encounters in October decreased 89% (106,316 vs 11,710) compared to last October. October opened Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, marking the lowest start to a fiscal year in recorded history.
- U.S. Border Patrol (USBP) apprehensions between ports of entry at the Southwest border in October (7,989) decreased 86% compared to October FY25 (56,515).
- In October, Border Patrol averaged 258 apprehensions per day on the Southwest border—95% lower than the daily average under the Biden administration.
- CBP encounters of inadmissible aliens at the Northern border dropped 71% in October FY26 (4,340) compared to October FY25 (15,207).
- For the sixth month in a row in October, the USBP released zero inadmissible aliens into American communities on parole, compared to the 10,009 inadmissible aliens that were released under the Biden-Harris administration last October.
- According to the Department of Homeland Security, threats and violence against Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and Border Patrol agents are on the rise compared to last year.
- On October 9th, the U.S. Coast Guard launched Operation River Wall to secure approximately 260 miles of Rio Grande River that makes up a portion of our Southwest border. The Coast Guard deployed watercraft, command center assets, and tactical teams to spearhead the patrol.
